NEW YORK, 10th Oct. 1886

My dear Mr Henry:-

I was just about writing you when your letter of 9th came in. I inform you that I have ended the Kapff litigation. After a long interview or interview and seeing Kapff with notice to produce certain papers on the trial, Kapff in writing has withdrawn the Assize and stipulated that judgment may be entered for closure and sale without previous notice to him, on the 3rd Monday of next week, and that he does not meet a check for \$750 which he has given me on account, dated 18th inst. (Oct.). ~~That~~ judgment may then be entered. I submitted your proposition to him but he would not consent to the entry of judgment at once, alleging that it would injure his standing down there. I think that the arrangement I have made is perhaps better than one which would have given him 12 months time.
