My dear Mr Henry:-

I was just about writing you when your letter of 9<sup>th</sup> came in. I inform you that I have ended the Kapff litigation. After a long interview or interview and coming Kapff with notice to produce certain papers on the trial, Kapff in writing has withdrawn the Assize and stipulated that judgment may be entered of fore closure and sale without further notice to him, on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Monday of next week, and that he does not meet me on account, dated 10<sup>th</sup> inst. (Oct.). ~~that~~ judgment may then be entered. I submitted my proposition to him but he would not consent to the entry of judgment at once, alleging that it would injure his standing down there. I think that the arrangement I have made is perhaps better than one which would have given him 12 months time.
