outillage appurtenant thereto, bounded on the north by the Hanwiding  
borough, Wrentham and Sarcaston Peab Road, on the east by property  
now or late of John Patterson, on the south by Cherry alley and on the  
west by Peab Road street; the said sum of One hundred and fifty-three  
dollars and ninety-one cents being a debt contracted for materials, to wit, lime,  
furnished by the said Henry Reich, within six months last past, for  
and about the erection and construction of said building of which Gabriel  
Pean was and is the owner or reputed owner & was the contractor, as  
charters and builders, and \_\_\_\_\_  
at whose instance and request said materials were furnished and provided  
as aforesaid, and the said Henry Reich claims to have a lien for the  
aforesaid sum, on the said building and lot or piece of ground and out-  
illage appurtenant to said building, from the commencement of the same  
according to the Act of Assembly, in such case made and provided; and  
said claimant hereto annexes a bill of particulars of the amount of the  
said debt showing the kind and amount of materials furnished and  
the time when same were furnished.
