is Denied by the said Stephan Sanders, who saith he is a free
Man, but hath not a single paper to shew, that he is free,
and at the risk and request of the said David Getz. he is
Committed, and you the said keeper are hereby required
to receive the said Stephan Sanders, into your custody in the
said Common Jail and him there safely to keep, until he be
Discharged by Law. Witness the said Geo: Matter, at Lancaster
the 28.th Day of November A.D. 1814.

YOU are hereby commanded, that the Body of *Stephen Saunders* under your custody detained, as it is said, together with the day and cause of *his* - being taken and detained, by whatsoever name the said *Stephen Saunders* shall be charged in the same, you have, under safe and secure conduct, before the honorable *the Judge of the Court of Common Pleas, at a Court of Common Pleas now holding at the Court House* in the borough of Lancaster, at *four* o'clock, *in the afternoon*; to do and receive all those things which the said Judge shall then and there consider of in this particular.

WITNESS the honorable *Walter Franklin*, Esquire, President of the Court of Common Pleas of said County, at Lancaster, the *twenty first* day of *March* — in the year of our LORD, one thousand eight hundred and *fifteen* —
