YOU are hereby commanded, that the Body^{ies} of *Rebecca Brown and Henry Brown* under your custody detained, as it is said, together with the day and cause of *their* being taken and detained, by whatsoever name the said *Rebecca and Henry* shall be charged in the same, you have, under safe and secure conduct, before the honorable *Walter Franklin*, ~~the Judges of Court of Common Pleas at a Court of Common Pleas~~ *now holding for said County in the Borough of Lancaster, at 3* in the borough of Lancaster, at *3* o'clock, in the *after* noon; ^{of this day} to do and receive all those things which the said Judges shall then and there consider of in this particular.

WITNESS the honorable *Walter Franklin*, Esquire, President of the Court of Common Pleas of said County, at Lancaster, the *twenty second* day of *August* in the year of our LORD, one thousand eight hundred and *fifteen*.
