YOU are hereby commanded, that the Body of *Hezekiah Herrington* a coloured man under your custody detained, as it is said, together with the day and cause of *his* being taken and detained, by whatsoever name the said *Hezekiah Herrington* shall be charged in the same, you have, under safe and secure conduct, before the honorable *the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas for the County of Lancaster, at a Court of Common Pleas, now holding,* in the borough of Lancaster, at ^{*fourth with*} ~~at~~ *o'clock*, in the ~~noon~~; to do and receive all those things which the said Judges shall then and there consider of in this particular.

WITNESS the honorable *Walter Franklin*, Esquire, President of the Court of Common Pleas of said County, at Lancaster, the *twenty first* day of *August* in the year of our LORD, one thousand eight hundred and *Sixteen*.
