YOU are hereby commanded, that the Body of *William Putler*, a man of colorⁿ under your custody detained, as it is said, together with the day and cause of *his* being taken and detained, by whatsoever name the said *William Putler* shall be charged in the same, you have, under safe and secure conduct, before the honorable *Walter Franklin Esqr*
President of the Court of Common Pleas of Lancaster County
at the Court house this day
in the borough of Lancaster, at *eleven* o'clock, in the *fore* noon; to do and receive all those things which the said Judge shall then and there consider of in this particular.

WITNESS the honorable *Walter Franklin*, Esquire, President of the Court of Common Pleas of said County, at Lancaster, the *second* day of *September* in the year of our LORD, one thousand eight hundred and *Sixteen*.

We find you here with the Body of William
Buddler a Coloured Man, who was this day brought
before Sam Carpenter, one of our Justices of the Peace
in and for the said County, by Adam Deller the High
Constable of the Borough of Lancaster in the County
of Lancaster aforesaid on a Charge of being a
runaway servant, of a certain Charles Green of the
City of Baltimore, and that the said Adam Deller
produced written documents, as well as a Printed
advertisement, and the insinuations of a certain Charles
Buddler of the Borough of Lancaster a Coloured Man who
calls him the Uncle of the said William Buddler
whereby it appears to our said Justices, that the
above Charge, ~~as a runaway servant~~ is founded
upon strong presumptions.

Shesd are therefore to command you to take
receive the said William Buddler, and him in safe
Custody keep until he be legally discharged by a
Legal Court of Law
