Eee) Whereas Ephraim Malson of Color, labourer hath been brought
before Joseph Mosher Esq. one of our Justices of the Peace in and
for said County, by virtue of his warrant charged on the solemn
affirmation of Samuel C. Bonham (one of the Administrators with the
Will annexed of Jacob Dritt Esq. deceased) with a strong hand and
against our peace making a forcible entry on an Island in the
Susquehanna River known by the name of the "Spice Island" belonging
to the estate of the said deceased and he the said Ephraim Malson having
been required to find sufficient surety as well for his appearance at
the next Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace to be holden for said County
to be proceeded against according to law as that in the mean time he
be of his good behaviour and keep the peace towards all our Citizens
and especially towards the said Samuel C. Bonham. — And whereas
the said Ephraim Malson hath refused and continues to refuse to find
sufficient surety as aforesaid. — These are therefore to command
you the said Constable to convey the said Ephraim Malson to the
common jail of the said County and deliver him to the Keeper thereof
who is hereby enjoined to receive the said Ephraim Malson and him
keep in safe custody until he find sufficient surety as aforesaid or
is otherwise legally discharged — Witness Joseph Mosher at the Borough
