or Estate & that he believes he is in danger in body
or Estate bearing had this day committed in
default of bail.

There are therefore to command you
the said Constable forthwith to take conveyance
and deliver the body of the said *Henry Green*
until he be thence delivered according to Law

this 11th day of July in the Year of our Lord 1885
