Sealed with our Seals and Dated this *Sixth* Day of *November* in the Year of our Lord, *One Thousand Seven Hundred and fifty Six*.

THE Condition of the above Obligation is such, That if the above-bounden *Margaret Carrigan*

Administratrix of all and singular the Goods and Chattles, Rights and Credits which were of *Patrick Carrigan* Deceased, Do make or cause to be made, a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods and Chattles, Rights and Credits, which were of the said Decedent at the Time of *his* Death, or which at any other Time has, or shall come to the Hands, Possession or Knowledge of the said *Margaret Carrigan* or unto the Hands or Possession of any other Person or Persons for *her* and the same so made, Do exhibit into the Registers Office of *Lancaster*, at or before the *Sixth* Day of *December* next ensuing, and the same Goods, Chattles and Credits, Doth well and truly Administer according to Law; and further Doth make or cause to be made, a true and just Account, Calculation or Reckoning of the said Administration, on or before the *Sixth* Day of *November* next, which will be in the Year of our Lord, *One Thousand Seven Hundred and fifty Seven* and all the Rest and Residue of the said Goods, Chattles and Credits which shall be found remaining upon the said Administrators Account, (the same being first examined and approved of by the Orphans Court of the County aforesaid) Do deliver and pay to such Person or Persons respectively as the said Orphans Court by their Decree or Sentence pursuant to the true Intent and Meaning of an Act entitled an Act for the better settling Intestates Estates, shall limit and appoint.
