all of the County of *Lancaster*, and Province of *Pennsylvania*, are held and firmly bound unto *Benjamin Chew* Esq; Register-General for the Probate of Wills, and granting Letters of Administration in the Province of *Pennsylvania*, in the Sum of *Two Thousand* Pounds, lawful Money of the said Province, to be paid unto the said *Benjamin Chew* or to his certain Attorney, Executors, Administrators, or Assigns. To the which Payment well and truly to be made, We do bind ourselves jointly and severally, our Heirs, Executors, and Administrators, each and every of them, firmly by these Presents. Sealed with our Seals; and dated this *Twenty first* Day of *August* in the Year of our LORD, One Thousand Seven Hundred and *Seventy Five*

THE Condition of the above Obligation is such, That
if the above-bounded *George Seech*

Administrator of all and singular the Goods and Chattles, and Credits, of *Francis Seech* deceased *doth* make, or cause to be made, a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods and Chattles, and Credits, of the said deceased, which have, or shall come to the Hands, Possession or Knowledge of the said *George Seech* or into the Hands or Possession of any other Person or Persons for *him* and the same so made, do exhibit, or cause to be exhibited, into the Register's Office in the County of *Lancaster*, at or before the *Twenty first* Day of *September* next ensuing, and the same Goods, Chattles, and Credits, and all other Goods, Chattles, and Credits, of the said deceased, at the Time of his Death, which at any Time after, shall come to the Hands or Possession of the said *George Seech* or into the Hands or Possession of any other Person or Persons for *him* well and truly administer, according to Law: And further, *doth* make, or cause to be made, a true and just Account of said Administration, at or before the *Twenty first* Day of *August* next, which will be in the Year of our Lord, One Thousand Seven Hundred and *Seventy Five* and all the Rest and Residue of the said Goods, Chattles and Credits, which shall be found remaining upon the said Administrators Account (the same being first examined and allowed of by the Orphan's Court of the County aforesaid) *doth* deliver and pay unto such Person or Persons respectively, as the said Orphan's Court by their Decree or Sentence (pursuant to the true Intent and meaning of an Act, intituled, "*An Act for the better settling Intestates Estates*") shall limit and appoint. And if it shall hereafter appear that any last Will and Testament was made by the said deceased, and the Executor and Executors therein named, do exhibit the same into the Registers Office *at Lancaster* making request to have it allowed and approved accordingly; if the said *George Seech* above-bounded being thereunto required, *doth* render and deliver the said Letters of Administration (Approbation of such Testament being first had and made in the said Register's Office) then this Obligation to be void, and of none Effect, or else to remain in full Force and Virtue.
