Know all men by these Presents, That *Margaret Usmar, Henry Wolfskill, Henry Frey and Charles Montelius* all of Cocolicoe township

are held and firmly bound unto the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in the sum of *Two thousand* dollars to be paid to the said Commonwealth for the use of the parties interested in the estate of *Andrew Usmar* late of Cocolicoe township *af<sup>d</sup>* deceased, to which payment, well and truly to be made, we bind ourselves jointly and severally, for and in the whole, our heirs, executors, and administrators, firmly by these presents. Sealed with our seals, and dated the *twenty eighth* day, of *July* in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and *eighteen*

The Condition of this Obligation is such, That

if the above-bounden *Margaret Usmar and Henry Wolfskill*

Administrators of all and singular the goods, chattles and credits of the said *Andrew Usmar* deceased, do make or cause to be made, a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, chattles and credits of the said deceased, which have or shall come to the hands, possession or knowledge of *them* the said *Margaret Usmar and Henry Wolfskill* or unto the hands and possession of any person or persons for *them* and the same so made, do exhibit, or cause to be exhibited, into the Register's office, in the county of Lancaster, on or before the *28<sup>th</sup>* day of *August* next ensuing; and the same goods, chattels and credits, and all other goods, chattels and credits, of the said deceased, at the time of *his* death, which at any time after shall come to the hands and possession of the said *M. Usman and H. Wolfskill*

or unto the hands and possession of any other person or persons, for *them* do well and truly administer according to law. And further do make, or cause to be made, a true and just account of *their* said administration, on or before the *28<sup>th</sup>* day of *July* in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and *nineteen* And all the rest and residue of said goods, chattels and credits, which shall be found remaining on the said administrators' account, (the same being first examined and allowed by the Orphan's court of the county of Lancaster,) shall deliver and pay unto such person or persons respectively, as the said Orphan's court by their decree or sentence, pursuant to the true intent and meaning of the several laws now in force in this Commonwealth, shall limit and appoint, and if it shall appear hereafter, that any last will and testament was made by the said deceased, and the executor or executors therein named, do exhibit the same into the Register's office making request to have it allowed and approved accordingly; and if then the above-bounden *Margaret Usman*

and *Henry Wolfskill* being thereunto required, do render and deliver the said letters of administration, approbation of such testament being first had and made in the said Register's office, then this obligation to be void and of none effect, or else to remain in full force and virtue.
