Biographical and Historical Note:

James Buchanan was born on April 23, 1791 to James Buchanan and Elizabeth Speer. He was the second child born out of ten children, and he would go on to outlive all but one of his siblings. Most popularly remembered as Pennsylvania's only President and as a lifelong bachelor, Buchanan committed a lifetime to politics. In 1821, he left his law practice and embarked on his political career after having been voted into the U.S. House of Representatives. He would remain in the House for five consecutive terms before serving as the U.S. Minister to Russia, a Senator in the U.S. Senate, the U.S. Secretary of State, the U.S. Minister to Great Britain, and finally, the 15th President of the United States. He died in his bedchamber at Wheatland at 8:30 AM on June 1, 1868. He was 77 years old. [https://www.lancasterhistory.org/about-wheatland, accessed 10/24/2019]

Strong's Dime Caricatures No. 2 showing the Union as Little Bo Peep, Old Hickory as a dead dog, Old Buck as a live dog but running from the action as imperial wolves pick off the seceding states except Virginia and Kansas. Land grant signed by President James Buchanan granting Warrant No. 56,331 for 120 acres in "Sauk Rapids, now St. Cloud, Minnesota," to John Vanlandingham, Georgia Militia, Florida War, who assigned it to James B. Clark. With seal. *Housed in JBFP Oversized Box 2.*

Folder 12 Washington, D.C., 1 January 1859

Land grant under the signature of President James Buchanan granting Warrant No. 8,537 for 160 acres in "Decorah, now Osage, Iowa," to Rachel Nimmon, widow of John Nimmon, Ohio Militia, War of 1812, who assigned it to Joseph S. Cox. With seal. *Housed in JBFP Oversized Box 2.*

Folder 13 Washington, D.C., 15 July 1859

Land grant under the signature of President James Buchanan granting Warrant No. 86,543 for 120 acres in "Plettsburg, now Bonneville, Missouri," to Matilda A. White, minor child of Thomas White, deceased, Maryland Militia, War of 1812, who assigned it to Peter McLaughlin and Henry F. Felix. *Housed in JBFP Oversized Box 2.*

Folder 14 Washington, D.C., 1 September 1859

Land grant under the signature of President James Buchanan granting 320 acres in Jackson, Missouri, to Alfred R. Moore of St. Louis County, Missouri, recorded in the Recorder's Office at Alton, Missouri, 6 June 1895. *Housed in JBFP Oversized Box 2.*

Land grant under the signature of President James Buchanan granting Warrant No. 47,058 for 120 acres "in Sauk Rapids, now St. Cloud, Minnesota," to Nathaniel Carpenter, New York Militia, War of 1812, who assigned the plot to James L. Abell. With seal. *Gift of Laura Baragar in honor of the Teelin Baragar families, 16 April 2010. Housed in JBFP Oversized Box 2.*

Land grant under the signature of President James Buchanan granting Warrant No. 48,116 for 120 acres "in Sauk Rapids, now St. Cloud, Minnesota," to John Doxtater, Junior, New York Militia, War of 1812, who assigned the plot to James L. Abell. With seal. *Gift of Laura Baragar in honor of the Teelin Baragar families, 16 April 2010. Housed in JBFP Oversized Box 2.*

Folder 19 Washington, D.C., 20 January 1868

German document signed by a police commissioner in Berlin dismissing Eugene François Theodore de la Croix, apparently a native of Sweden, from his position as bookkeeper. (Related to Folder 15 above.)

Document in French, Spanish, English and German, granting Master John A. Coffin of the Mount Wollaston permission to depart New Bedford, Massachusetts, for the Pacific Ocean on a whaling voyage. Presidential seal. Signed by James Buchanan and Leo Cass, Secretary of State. *Housed in JBFP Oversized Box 2.*

Folder 21 Danville, Illinois, 9 September 1857

Document stating that a caveat has been filed in the General Land Office, Danville, Illinois, regarding the assignment of a military bounty land certificate from Henry C. Fink to John Watts. Signed by Thomas A. Hendricks, Commissioner. Manuscript copy.

Folder 22 Washington, D.C., 1 May 1830

Land grant for Warrant #19305 for 80 acres near Omaha, Nebraska, granted to Abel Pennington who assigned it to Meredith Osburn who assigned it to Edward Wharburton. Signed by James Buchanan and J. B. Leonard, Secretary. *Housed in JBFP Oversized Box 2.*

Folder 27 Washington, D.C., 2 May 1860

Land grant to Sarah Board, widow of Nathan Board, private in Captain Sherman's Company, Virginia Militia, War 1812 of 80 acres in Jackson, Missouri, and assigned by the widow to Legrand Byington. *Gift of Lester M. Lichty. Housed in JBFP Oversized Box 2.*
