My Dear Sir,

Yr [sic] suggestion that Mr [sic] North'[sic] fee should be paid out of the money aggregate of the money retained for the Biographical Fund, strikes me as the best way of meeting the difficulty about the way in wh [sic] it shall be paid. It also seems to me to be a perfectly <u>legitimate</u> way. I therefore enclose a check for the amount, (\$50), for Mr [sic] North, wh [sic] be kind enough to hand him. Also please get from him such a rec^t [sic] as will serve as a voucher in the management of the \$1875 Fund.

I find on looking at my memoranda that the amt [sic] of the surplus Interest rec^d [sic] by me was \$3.78. I will call it \$4 however, & deduct, as you suggest, \$2.25 from each share I pay. I propose to send checks & releases to-day to Mr [sic] Henry & Mrs [sic] Dunham. John Weaver expects to be here this evening in person.

I am thankful to be able to say I am better than when Annie wrote.

Since writing the above, I have concluded, instead of sending a check to you for \$50 for Mr North, to send one for \$60.75 payable to yourself, out of wh [sic] you can pay him. The remaining \$10.75 is for the \$2.25 wh [sic] I propose to retain from each of the 3 shares wh [sic] I am to pay, & the \$4 additional, wh [sic] I rec^d [sic] as surplus Interest from the W Saving Fund.
