My Dear Sir,

Among the papers of the Estate in my possession are a short Defence [sic] of the Administration by Judge Black a letter from Mr [sic] Schell to the Judge & one from him in reply & a number of letters from Mr Stanton to my brother. Some of these letters & the Defence [sic], Mr [sic] Baker, Mr Reed & myself all think it would be well to publish at this time. <u>Although I am about to give copies of some of them to Mr Reed, per Mr [sic] Baker, yet I will not consent to the publication of them, unless you are agreed</u>. Will you be kind enough to inform me on the receipt of this, what you think. Are you willing that they shall be published? Judge B' [sic] correspondence with Mr [sic] Schell & his Defence of the Administration I think it quite important to publish.

I have recd the Trustee account sent through Mr [sic] Swift, & will have it executed, if possible, & returned to you on Monday or Tuesday. I went to our Alderman on Thursday, to have it executed; but he had left his seal in town. I intended to go again last evening, but the heavy rain prevented me.
