My Dear Friend

Your letter of 19 [sic] enclosing a check up on the Chemical Bank New York I have received and really don't know how to thank you for your great kindness. I was greatly in need of the means, and your prompt assistance will relieve me of great trouble. I send the note according to your direction, but am afraid nine months will not give me time enough to save (from our present income) as much as six hundred. I will, I assure you, do the best I can. Many thanks for your kind invitation to visit you again. I shall surely take advantage of the first opportunity to do so, my first and only visit shall ever be remembered with great pleasure. Say to Jessie I will write to her next week. The kindest regards from Capt Magaw and love from myself
