Dear Jim,

After writing you a letter and not getting any reply you giving the excuse that you did not know where to go to" Well I did get a letter from home to come but I preferred staying until October until I could learn the guitar – which I am learning now. Goose came up Saturday we kept up a correspondence all the time he is a perfect bird. I – got a letter from [Stareley] who said you had entered but he did not mention what class well Davis is gone we have a new teacher – old MacRow has abscolulated [sic] also. Goose sends his love along with <u>Baker So is Kinzer</u>; I am getting along very well in French & Spanish. Our division has been weakened. Kinzer. Kinzer. Robinson. Ross, Wills Chestnut. Moses. No big Boys left. Jim as I am afraid of being caught I must close for Mr. Bolmar has just come in I will write you a longer letter next time write soon. Yours till death
