Have you any idea when you will go south this year, [sic] my plans are very indefinite about getting any where [sic] out of this place for some time although it is just possible tkat [sic] I may be able to get down at Christmas, any expeditions before that seem to be out of the question.

I suppose all Annapolis will go to Philadelphia for the game but after the way the team has been playing so far it will be pretty discouraging, still there is always a chance for a brace at the last minute; there is a very good game here today between Harvard and the Indians that the other fellows went to but though [sic] I had better stick to the House.

Isn't Cousin Jessie's wedding rather sudden or have they been engaged for some time already. [sic]

The box of drawing instruments will fill more of the list of things that we have to buy ourselves so that is quite a saving but with that exception the other box was the one that had most of the things that I wanted, this box was the one that I sent from Newport and curiously enough the other day I ran across the express receipt for it so if it had not been found I would have had them, [sic] I must say I'm almost tempted to write Mr [sic] Melvin a letter and tell him what I think of his methods of doing business although as that would probably do no good guess I'll refrain and make a virtue out of necessity although the next time I happen to drift into Annapolis it will not be too late to tell him a few things about it.

There haven't been any changes up here since the last time I wrote and things are running along in about the same old way.
