We have just heard the score of yesterdays [sic] game, at first we could hardly believe it I cant [sic] imagine what must be the matter with every one [sic] I dont [sic] suppose in the history of the Academy any team has made such a showing as this one, so at least there is some consolation to those of us who will not be able to go th [sic] Philadelphia for the game, if by any chance we should win and that hardly seems possible it would just go to show that luck or something else eneres [sic] into the game so much that the best team may just have a streak of bad luck and loose [sic].

The paper with the account of Hannah Randalls [sic] wedding came all right and I was very glad to get it as of course it had a great deal more about it than any of the other papers, there must have been quite a time in old Annapolis, wish that I could have gotten down for it but of course that was impossible I had a letter from Manley a few days after the wedding in which he said that he had seen you there, there were three or four of our class who got down for it but the rest were all too far away.
