Dear Sir

Yours of the 21st rec^d and note contents. I learn thro R. J. Bowen as per enclosed that has been owned by Rich^d D Davis John Patten & Judge Hiram Barber. Judge Barber lives in Wisconsin but I know nothing of the other parties & presume they are not living. I gave these names to the county clerk & asked him if possible to complete chain. I am liable to hear from him any mail and as soon as do will advise result. I will now give him the name of Henry Davis to whom the grant was 1st made & this may help him. This may have been the only Davis that has ever owned it.

We are having a cold spell now. The Lake is frozen over and I presume Brown is doing or perhaps has done the work, tho I have not heard.

I do not think of anything more to ask Judge Pratt or how he can be of any further service.
