Created, by virtue of a Resolution of the Select and Common Councils, of the City of Lancaster dated, January 2, 1844 to pay bond No. now due and claimed.

COUNCIL CHAMBER, }

Lancaster, January 30th 1844 }

Be it known, That there is due, from the City of Lancaster, Pennsylvania, to Bernhard Flynn or his assigns, the sum of *One Hundred Dollars*, bearing interest at six per cent per annum, from the thirtieth day of January 1844 payable semi-annually, at the Treasurer's Office, in each year, the principal re-imbursable [sic] by the City at any time after five years from the date hereof; and the faith of the City is hereby pledged for the payment of the same.
