

CAMP BRANDYWINE.

The undersigned, Committee appointed at a meeting of the Generals of the several Brigades, the Commissioned officers of the Several Volunteer Companies, and the Field and Staff Officers of the 4th Division, P. M., held at the city of Lancaster, for the purpose of making arrangements to effect the organization of a Military Encampment, to be held at the village of Ephrata, Lancaster county, in SEPTEMBER NEXT, have been instructed by said meeting respectfully to invite the attendance of The Hon. James Buchanan [name written in ink] at the aforesaid Military Encampment, which will commence on the 9th of said month, and continue until the 13th.

The object of the Encampment will be to lay the corner stone of a Monument to be erected to the memory of two hundred Soldiers of the American Revolution, buried in the vicinity of the village, who were wounded at the battle of Brandywine, and who died in the hospitals at Ephrata. As the design of the Encampment is purely patriotic in its character, and is intended as a tribute of our regard for the memory of our country's benefactors, we would cordially impress upon ~~the above mentioned company~~ [Mr. B. written in the right margin] the propriety of attending upon that occasion.
