Bro. James Buchanan was initiated December 11, 1816, and in 1820 was elected Junior Warden. He was elected Senior Warden in 1821 and Worshipful Master in 1822. He was the first District Deputy Grand Master for District No. 1 (then comprising the counties of Lancaster, York and Lebanon,) having been appointed December 27, 1823. His death occurred June 1868 and his funeral was conducted by Lodge No. 43, Free and Accepted Masons.

Both of the recommenders on this petition were prominent men. Brother John Reynolds, (W. M., 1816) was editor of <u>The Lancaster Journal</u>. He was the father of General John F. Reynolds, who was killed at Gettysburg, Rear Admiral William Reynolds of the U. S. Navy, and General James L. Reynolds. Brother Molton C. Rogers, (W. M., 1815) was an attorney-at-law. He was Recorder of the Mayor's Court, State Senator, Secretary of the Commonwealth, and for twenty-five years a Justice of the Supreme Court.
