Dear Mrs. Hostetter:

I am enclosing herewith a copy of the inscriptions on the tombstones of Harriet Lane and her husband and the inscriptions on the stones marking the graves of her children. These monuments are in the Greenmount cemetery in Baltimore in the lot belonging to the family of Henry Johnston. The stone that marks the grave of Harriet Lane and her husband, as you will see by the accompanying rough sketch, a Celtic cross ornamented with an early Irish intertwined design which is not shown in the sketch.. In the center of the arms of the cross is a small cross trefle surmounted by the letters Alpha and Omega; on the orle of the cross is the following motto, "The souls of the righteous are in the hand of God". [sic] The cross is made of brown stone, probably granite. The enclosed inscription is on the wide space at the base. This Celtic cross is between two plain degraded Latin crosses of white marble, marking the graves of her sons. The upper step of the gradus is draped with a spray of lilies in each case. I should estimate the height of the central Celtic cross as about eleven feet.
