Mrs. Harriet Lane Johnston died in July 19[03], and left by her will the sum of \$100,000 to William A. Fisher, of Baltimore, Calderon Carlisle and E. Francis Riggs of Washington, and Lawrason Riggs of Baltimore as Trustees, to provide first, a monument at Stone Batter near Mercersburg, Pa., the birth place of her uncle, President Buchanan, and second, to secure from the Congress of the United States the designation of a suitable site in the city of Washington to be approved and accepted by them, the trustees aforesaid, and the permission and consent of Congress to erect on said site a statue in bronze or marble of her uncle James Buchanan, the said statue to be paid for by her trustees out of the fund hereinbefore provided. And the said trustees were authorized forthwith to procure proper designs or models for said statue with a view to the selection of a suitable design and the submission of the same to Congress in connection with their application for the necessary authority and permission in regard to the site. Mrs. Johnston further directed that on the pedestal of the statue the trustees aforesaid should place, in addition to other appropriate inscriptions, the noble and truthful words applied to her uncle by the Honorable Jeremiah S. Black, "The incorruptible statesman whose walk was upon the mountain ranges of the law."
