Booklet on the Hershey Machine & Foundry Co., Manheim, Pa., 1900-1925. List of owners 1868-1925, plant photographs and layout 1904-1925, and list of employees by year of service.

Booklet "Lancaster County, Penn., Iron Ore, 1843" containing two pages (387-388) of an unknown publication. It is a portion of an article titled "Lancaster County." Page 388 gives information on early ironmasters and summarizes the 1840 manufacturing establishment census. Ironmaster names are Kurtz, Grubb, Henry William Stiegel, Olds and Robert Coleman.

Order. Wm. Coleman & Co. of Martick Works ordering bar iron and borax. Addressed to John F. Steinman. Other name: James Alexander, 1826.
