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## **Folder 1** Annie L. Herr book

Pages were removed from an earlier book with handscripted mathematics problems to accommodate pasted-on and loosely inserted recipes. (The latter have been removed and placed in inserts in Folder 2.)

The flyleaf reads "Annie L. Herr, 1881, Lancaster, Pa." A two page index, unfortunately missing part of the first page, follows and then the recipes for food, plants, dyeing, laundry, and miscellaneous.

## **Folder 2** Loose recipes from the Annie L. Herr book

**Insert 1** From Page 18, seven recipes ranging from wheaten loaf, jellies, fine flour, washing made easy, meats, desserts, sweeping and dusting, and an instruction booklet for using the Etruscan coffee pot.

**Insert 3** From Page 24, bean soup.

**Insert 4** From Page 36, nursery dress or petticoat.

**Insert 5** From Page 46, simple summer desserts.

**Insert 6** From Page 56, Thanksgiving recipes from Mrs. Harrison (President Harrison's wife) and other Washington dignitaries.

**Insert 7** From Page 78, to keep eggs.

**Insert 8** From Page 82, Fleischmann yeast directions.

**Insert 9** From Page 88, waffles and sweet potatoes.

**Folder 3** Recipes submitted by local women to a [city directory]. Pot roast chicken, fricadelles, drop dumplings with meat, boiled ham, blind birds, corn pudding, Boston baked beans, corn omlet, corn fritters, baked onions. No date.
