The army is now in motion in front of us, and I suppose there will be a heavy battle fought near the old Bull Run battle field. which is now in anticipation, but do not let them come across the Susqihana for Joe Hooker is in his rear and I think, Lee, will find a warm reception in Penn we are anxiously awaiting to hear the news of the fall of Port Hudson and Vicksburg and hope it will be a desisive blow to crush this rebellion. I will send you that present present I could not get it as good as I want it for Matilda and Sarah That is our work here making rings.
