Transcript:

Camp Israel Md. October 10th 1862

My dear little Lillie:

Mamma writes me word that you are sick, and I feel very sorry. I do hope that you will soon get well, and that the next letter from home will say, that, Lillie is well and can play as lively as ever, out front. I want you to write me another letter – it is a long time since I received a funny letter from you or Master Blanton. If you are well enough to go to Sabbath School, tell Mrs. Mullen that Amos is quite well, and so is Henry, who comes to see us some times.

You must take a walk up to see Aunt Lizzie and Uncle Peter and tell them that Howard is very well and full of fun. And you must tell Mrs. Wike that Henry is well. And if any-body asks you how your Papa is, tell them that he is well, but is very anxious to see his dear little children.

And now I want you to tell Mama to hurry and send my Box with overcoat watch &c. to me, directed to Harpers Ferry. It will then come right straight to my Camp without any trouble – and I will be so glad to have an overcoat particularly when I may have to sleep out of doors at night. Please tell mamma to hurry and send it now while there is a good chance for one day lost may be too late.


