My Dear Child

I received your letter also the one from your cousin Mollie and was pleased to hear from you. I am delighted at the great improvement in your writing composition &c. and now feel satisfied that during my absence from home Alice and Mamma can correspond very frequently with me. Adj<sup>t</sup> arrived yesterday bringing my box, the cake was very nice and much relished by myself and mess. Mamma can send us good things very often now, an [and] it only takes about 24 hours to come here. I received a letter from Jim – he wants to join the Army – I will perhaps send for him some of these days —

I am very well so are the boys. they are all delighted with their new place. I think we will have it very pleasant. I send an officer and a few soldiers up with every train of cars as a guard. Adj<sup>t</sup>. Budding went to Fredericksburg this morning with Serg<sup>t</sup> Miles and two of the boys. they will be back in a few hours. Then some others will go with next train &c.

The boys think this will be the best place we have been yet. Will McClure is with his Papa and Amos Mullen in Camp almost 4 miles from here.

Give my love to Mollie and tell her I will write very soon. Also give my love to Mamma and all the girls and love Blant a great deal for me.

Any person can come to see us now as there are two Boats every day from Washington—one is a government Boat the other carries passengers and freight <u>not</u> belonging to the Army.

If Mrs. Wike or Mrs. Hinkle or any body else wants to send things to the boys they can do so easily by express.

I think we will stay here some time.
