General,

The enclosed dispatch was rec^d this morning to which I sent the following

reply.

"Gen Welsh is at Jamestown to day. He transferred Col. Leasures Reg't to the 1st Brigade, thus placing him in command. He did this because he did not think that the Junior Colonel of the Division should command a Brigade while the Senior Colonel had only a Reg't. Col. Bowan is in temporary command of Gn. Welsh's Brigade."
