Two tracts of Land belonging to

These lands are 2 or 3 miles
 back from the river, I don't know how far,
 along ^{that way} ~~with~~ the river runs the canal
 but crosses the river at the Dam of the
 Trimmer's - within the last 3 years
 the Santa R.R. have extended

This road from Scanton down
to Mitchell's, Moby. Condit's
with the Phil. RR and with
the ^{Quincy} Erie RR ~~leading~~ leading to Erie,
as well as the Elmira Road
leading to Elmira.

By the old maps this land
appeared to be in the Antietam
Coal Basin, but subsequent
Examination ~~of~~ renders this extremely
doubtful. The wood must
necessarily be cut away a good
deal by pilferers as all mountain
land is in that region.

The timber on the land originally
was pine, hemlock & some oak
Taxes all paid to 1866
