

Westchester y^e 25th Feby. 1792

Sir

The Chief Justice writes me that by a late regulation all the Judges in the State are to be paid up to the first day of this year, and afterwards to be paid at the same time quarterly, & mentions that my Warrant agreeable to this regulation, may be had at any time.

On my leaving home I had thoughts of troubling one of the Gentlemen who attend this Court, to wait on you for a Warrant for a Quarters Salary which would end the last of this, but having notice of this arrangement shall cheerfully conform to it. & shall be much obliged by your handing my Warrant for one Months Salary, which ended with the last of December to Joseph Thomas Esquire. I think it amounts to forty one Pounds Thirteen Shillings & four pence which sum he has left with me to save the trouble & risque of sending it to Lancaster.
