May 6. Received from Mr. Joseph Hubley 8³ 11 old Silver chiefly old
foreign Coin, for which I am to allow him ^{8³ Dets} 9³ 00 according
to its Quality: N. B. lost 10 of part of the above in Refining

Received also 3⁰³ old silver for which I am to allow likewise
agreeable to its Quality: N. B. This is to be distinct from the ^{other} part.

June 24: ^{Dets for} Received 9³ 12 old silver to add to the other & ^{Dets for} 1³ 13 Gold

Feb. 7. 1789. ^{Dets for} Received 17³ 6 silver to add to the other being a Cobb dollar

May 14. 1789 C. ^{Dets} By a Silver Seal W. 8³ 11/9 Copied

This silver is charged at 8 Shillings per ounce the Gold at
6 Shillings & Dets. John Ewing
