To the Sheriff of Lancaster County Greeting

Whereas complaint upon Solemn Affirmation hath been made unto us William Henry & <sup>Paul Lantzinger</sup> ~~Michael Hutter~~ Esquires two of the Justices of the peace for the County of Lancaster by Philip Brendle, that he did Demise unto a certain Christian Ehleman a certain piece or Tract of one hundred Acres of Land & premises Situate in the Township of Brecknock in the County of Lancaster aforesaid for a certain time which is now Expired rendering a certain Yearly Rent which said Term expired on or before the first day of April in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & eighty one. That at the time of making the said Lease or Demise he the said Philip Brendle was quietly and peaceably possessed of the said piece or Tract of one hundred Acres of Land & Premises, that he the said Philip Brendle had demanded the said Christian Ehleman to remove from and leave the said piece or Tract of one hundred Acres of Land and premises at the Expiration of the said Lease or Demise that he the said Christian Ehleman hath refused so to do. And that three Months are expired since the said Philip Brendle made the said request

There are therefore to command you to Summon twelve substantial Freeholders to appear before us within four days next after the date hereof at the Court-house in the Borough of Lancaster aforesaid and also Summon the said Christian Ehleman at the same time to appear before us to shew cause if any he hath, why Restitution of the said Demised Premises should not be forthwith made to the said Philip Brendle Given under our hands and Seals the Twelfth Day of July in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & eighty one.
