I Phely Frazer of the Township of Little-Britain and  
County of Lancaster Farmer do hereby return That (to  
the Best of my Knowledge) George a Negro male Child  
son of Hannah a Female Negro Slave for life was  
Registered at Lancaster the 14<sup>th</sup> Day of October 1780  
George was born on the fourth Day of July in the  
year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and  
eighty five and that the aforesaid Negro Child  
is to be Required pursuant to an Act of General  
Assembly of Pennsylvania for the gradual  
Abolition of Slavery and which Child is my Property  
and liable by the Act aforesaid to serve until  
he shall arrive to the age of twenty eight years  
Witness my hand this 25<sup>th</sup> day of March Dom: 1789
