 I Michael Nicholas of the Township of Donegal in the County of
 Lancaster Innkeeper, Do hereby enter and return, That Sally a
 Negroe Female Child, the Daughter of Negroe Phillis a Female Slave,
 was born on the Twelfth Day of April in the Year of our Lord One
 thousand Seven hundred and Ninety; and that her said Mother Phillis
 was duly entered and registered at Lancaster as a Slave pursuant to the
 Act "for the Gradual Abolition of Slavery" and that the aforesaid
 Negroe Child Sally is my Property and liable to serve until it shall
 arrive to the Age of Twenty eight Years. Witness my Hand the Twenty
 second Day of September, in the Year of our Lord One thousand Seven
 hundred and Ninety
