my knowledge) Gull a Negro Female Child the
Daughter of Negroe Phillis a female Slave was born on or
about the second day of May in the Year of our Lord one
thousand seven hundred and Ninety one, And that her
said Mother Phillis was duly Registered by me at Lancaster
on the Eleventh day of September 1780. as a Slave—
pursuant to the Act "for the Gradual abolition of Slavery"
and that the aforesaid Negro Child Gull is may-
property and liable by the aforesaid Act, to serve untill
she shall arrive to the Age of Twenty eight Years. —
Witness my Hand the eighth day of July — 1791. —
