I Joseph Hubley of the Borough of Lancaster in the County of Lancaster Attorney at Law. Do hereby enter and return. That William a Negro Male Child the Son of Poll Footman a Female Slave was born the Twentieth Day of May in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and Ninety One, and that the said Mother Poll was duly entered and Register'd by the late William Parr Esquire deceased (her former Master) at Lancaster as a Slave, pursuant to the said Act of Assembly entitled "An Act for the Gradual Abolition of Slavery" And the aforesaid Negro Child William is my property and liable to serve untill it shall arrive to the Age of Twenty eight Years. Witness my Hand the 26th Day of September Anno Domini 1791
