In Pursuance of an Act of Assembly of the State of Pennsylvania, I John Watson of the Township of Donegal, in the County of Lancaster, Traditioner, of Physick, do hereby enter and return that Briton a Mulatoo Male Child the Son of Negroe Addah a Female Slave, was born on the Twenty first Day of October, in the Year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and Ninety two, and that ~~the~~ said Mother Addah was duly entered and registered at Lancaster, as a Slave, pursuant to the Act "for the gradual Abolition of Slavery"; and that the aforesaid Mulatoo Child Briton is my Property and liable to serve until it shall arrive to the Age of Twenty eight Years. Witness my Hand the seventeenth Day of December, in the Year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and Ninety two
