In pursuance of an Act of Assembly of the State of Pennsylvania, I Robert Spear, of the Township of Hempfield, in the County of Lancaster, Farmer, do hereby enter and return, That Fanny a Negro Female Child, the Daughter of Deborah a Negro Female Slave, was born on the fifth Day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and Ninety three, and that her said Mother Deborah was duly entered and registered by me at Lancaster, as a Slave, pursuant to the Act "For the gradual Abolition of Slavery" and that the aforesaid Negro Child Fanny is my Property, and liable to serve until it shall arrive to the Age of Twenty eight years. Witness my Hand and Seal the Twenty ninth Day of May, in the Year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and Ninety three
