

I Jasper Yeates of the Borough of Lancaster in the County of Lancaster Attorney at Law one of the Executors of Peter Grubb late of Warwick Townships in the County aforesaid Iron Master deceased, and also one of the Guardians over the Persons & Estates of his minor Children & Devisees Bura Grubb & Henry Bates Grubb a present Scholars in the public Academy at York in the County of York, do hereby return that (to the best of my Knowledge) Hannah a Negro female Child the Daughter of Negro Nancy a female Slave was born on or about the fifteenth Day of April one thousand seven hundred and eighty four, and that Amy a Negro female Child of the said Nancy was born on or about the third Day of October one thousand seven hundred and eighty seven, and that Negro Fanny a female Child of Negro Amy was born on or about the nineteenth Day of September one thousand seven hundred & eighty two. And that their said Mothers Nancy & Amy were duly registered by the said Peter Grubb in his life Time at Lancaster on the twenty first Day of October 1780 as Slaves pursuant to the Act "for the gradual Abolition of Slavery" and that the aforesaid Negro Children Hannah Amy & Fanny are the Property of the said Bura Grubb & Henry Bates Grubb and liable by the Act aforesaid to serve until they shall respectively arrive to the Age of twenty eight Years.
