<u>Scope and Content Note</u>: The Coulter and Hepler Land Records contain property records for land in southeastern Lancaster County that once belonged to the Reids, Coulters, and Heplers. The records include deeds, land drafts, and articles of agreement. There is also a desk blotter for I. P. Hepler.

<u>Creators</u>: Hepler, Walter Rupert, 1897-1967; Hepler, Esther E. Sheaffer, 1901-1997; Coulter, Rankin Martin, 1860-1929; Coulter family.

<u>Biographical and Historical Note</u>: Walter R. and Esther E. Hepler (parents of donor) purchased a farm from R. M. Coulter in 1929. The farm was located in Bart Twp. and Colerain Twp. with an address of 113 Rosedale Road, Quarryville. In the early 1930s, Walter was injured in a farm accident and the family had to sell the farm in a sheriff's sale. They subsequently lived with Esther's parents and helped on their farm, earning 50¢ per week plus meals and shelter. Somehow, Walter was able to keep the family's truck through these difficult times.

He later was employed as manager at the Capital Theatre in Lancaster where he earned \$14.75 per week. He moved the family into a three-story house in Lancaster with indoor plumbing and electricity, which was an exciting change for the children—James and his sister, Dorothy. As the U.S. emerged from the Depression and entered World War II, Walter used his carpentry skills to obtain a position in the shipyards and earned \$2.37½ per day. James Hepler retired from Trojan Yachts as a boat-builder.

Originally land of Thomas Read, then of his son, Nathan Read, and then of Nathan's widow, Sarah, who later married Andrew Read. Adjoined by John and Mary Thompson, John Read, and vacant land. Surveyed by Benjamin Eastburn. 12 April 1733.

Insert 2 Bond between Andrew Reid of Sadsbury Twp., Lancaster County and Nathaniel Coulter and Samuel Coulter of Sadsbury Twp., Lancaster County. 14 August 1741.

Insert 3 Indenture between Andrew and Sarah Reid of West Sadsbury Twp., [Lancaster] County and Nathaniel Coulter, Samuel Coulter, and Hugh Coulter of West Sadsbury Twp., [Lancaster] County for land in West Sadsbury Twp. 12 October 1745.
