

Thursday May 24th 1860 We went to Dunlaps Warm & beautiful Clear

Friday May 25th 1860 Warm & beautiful a little cloudy at times. I went to McClures, & Dr Wallaces.

Saturday May 26th 1860. Cloudy dark day Rained at night

Sabbath May 27th 1860 Cloudy & threatening to rain 10 AM At prayer meeting. 10 1/2 At Pequea from Isa. 40. 4. first clause 3 PM At Pleasant Grove, from Matt. 16. 26. 7 3/4 PM

At young mens prayer meeting at D. Lees Rained

Monday 28th Foggy 10 AM At the funeral of Mrs Sarah Armstrong, wife of Martin Armstrong Rev. James Latta Preached from Gen. 23. 1. I followed him with exhortation & prayer. Cleared off very pleasant

Tuesday Clear & beautiful warm

Wednesday Cloudy & cool We visited the family of James A Buyers Thunder gust in the afternoon fine rain Anthony Bender was struck with lightning; but not killed

Thursday May 31st 1860 We visited some families in the neighbourhood of Coopersville. ^{gust in the afternoon.} Friday June 1st 1860 This is the fifth anniversary of the painful operation of removing a tumour from the left side of my neck: "Hitherto hath the Lord brought me." Blessed be his holy name forever & ever. Very cool wind

We visited some families at Springville Cloudy all day

Saturday June 2nd Very cool: high wind from west

Sabbath June 3rd 1860 10 At Sabbath School, & then at prayer meeting 10 1/2 At Pequea from Luke 9. 55. 3 At Sabbath School, Linneville. After addressing the children & teachers, I closed the School by prayer, & then Preached from Matt. 16. 26. 7 3/4 PM At young mens prayer meeting. Afternoon cloudy & towards evening a little rain. Clear before noon

Monday Clear & pleasant before noon We visited Mrs Martin. who was very low & at times, suffering extremely. Cloudy afternoon. Gust after gust afternoon & night.

Tuesday Cloudy & frequent showers - I visited & addressed Mr Lees school warm Roads very bad.

Wednesday Cloudy & some rain. Afternoon Clear & pleasant We visit Uncle Tom Baldwells family

Thursday, visited Mrs Martin, who, was very low. Afternoon visited Meadville School & addressed the Pupils. There was a smart Rain; I visited also the sick child of John Sinderman.

Friday June 8th 1860. The Sun arose clear, but soon clouded over & a little after 6 A.M., a thunder gust past over from the South west with heavy Rain; It then seemed to clear; but afternoon gust followed gust with loud thunder, heavy rain with hail & strong wind: very cold for the season. Mrs Martin died June 7th 1860. about 7 P.M.

Saturday 9th 1860. 10 A.M. At the funeral of Mrs Martin from 1 Thess. 4. 14. Very cool for the season.

Sabbath June 10th 1860. 10¹/₂ P. Rev Mr Duffield preached from Heb. 12. 1; 2. 3 P.M. I preached at Springville from Matt 21. 28. ult. ^{7¹/₂ At young mens prayer meeting at Lees.}

Monday We visited the bereaved children of Mrs Martin

Tuesday June 12th Attended the adjourned meeting of Donegal Presbytery at Strasburg; & ordained & installed Mr Coogley. James B Kennedy was received as a candidate for the gospel Ministry The day pleasant & cool

Wednesday evening we were visited by Rev J. M. Crawford & Sister Ann Mary Thursday Daughter Rachel visited us Pleasant weather

Friday Daughters Margaret Jane & Rachel, Martha Patton, Isabel Wallace, James B Kennedy & Mr Mc Atee visited us. Very pleasant weather. It looked gusty

Saturday June 16th 1860. There was gust after gust, from morning until about the middle of the afternoon; accompanied with a great deal of loud thunder heavy rain & some places a considerable quantity of hail. & high wind

Sabbath June 17th 1860 9 A.M. At the funeral of a daughter of George Friberger from Luke 12. 20. middle clause 10¹/₂ At Pequea from 2 Cor. 5. 14. 3 P.M. At Compass Hall from John 18. 40. 7¹/₂ At young mens prayer meeting at our house. There were frequent showers before & afternoon.

Monday Clear & pleasant. It rained during the night

Tuesday June 19th 1860 We went to Lancaster cloudy & a smart shower before noon. In the evening gust followed gust heavy thunder We had to stop twice on our way home

Wednesday Cool wind gusty afternoon

Thursday June 21st 1860. Cloudy & disagreeably cold. We lay under sheet comfort ^{& quilt}

Friday Clear & cold We lay under Sheet Comfort & quilt

Saturday 23rd Cold & clear excellent hay weather.

Sabbath June 24th 1860 10 At Sabbath School. 10¹/₄ At prayer meeting 10¹/₂ At Pequea from Ephes 5. 14. 3 At Mount Rock from 2 Cor. 6. 2. ult. 7¹/₂ At prayer meeting at the house of Daniel Lee. Clear & Cool. We lay at night under a Sheet a comfort & a quilt & were not too warm

Monday June 25th 1860 We went to Hattville, & brought Mother Buyers home with us Midday warm look in the morning & evening

Tuesday June 26th 1860 Warm I got a load of excellent hay from Samuel Worst - Married ~~apex~~ a pair Went to Churchtown with Mr Ritter house & took Mrs McMill with me, Organized a Church at said place I made the ordaining prayer. Excellent hay weather

Wednesday Warm I got a load of excellent hay from Jacob Warner (David's son) - 88, Cloudy. Thundered some, but no rain

Thursday June 28th 1860. I got a load of excellent hay of Johnny Klutz, 89. After night there a thunder gust & fine rain

Friday Cloudy & warm in the morning It became windy & clear 89.

Samuel Worst, brought me a load of hay, from Solomon Warner.

Between five & six o'clock A sudden squall of wind & shower of rain passed over.

Saturday June 30th 1860. 9 A.M. At the funeral of Benjamin Bowers, - aged 19 years 1 month & 27 days. He was killed by the pulley of a hay hoister in Peter Eby's Barn. I preached from James 4. 14. first clause.

Sabbath July 1st 1860 10 A.M. At prayer meeting 10 1/2 At Bequea from 1 John 4. 8. last clause, "God is love." 3 1/2 At Mount Pleasant met Mr Thorn, Psa. 36. 2. 7 3/4 P.M. At youngmens prayer meet

at our house
Monday 2nd Took Mother Buyers home. I stopped at F. McClures, & at Mrs Lively's. - Some were cutting wheat.

Tuesday 3rd We visited at William Robinsons. It rained that night It was quite cool for the season. Cutting what in places.

Wednesday 4th Pleasant. Annie went home with her father, & Oliver Martin. Mary Waggoner visited us. Rain at night

Thursday A little rain. The wind became boisterous in the afternoon & disagreeably cold. We slept that night under a sheet & quilt.

Friday more disagreeably cold & boisterous. We slept under a sheet, comfort, & quilt. H. Wilson Robinson sent me a fine load of hay.

Saturday July 7th Still cold & high wind all day. We slept under a sheet comfort, & quilt.

Sabbath July 8th 1860. 10 At prayer meeting, 10 1/2 At Bequea from Matt. 13. 39. middle clause 3. At Pleasant Grove, from Heb. 2. 3. 7 3/4 P.M. at young mens prayer meeting at the house of D. See. We slept under a sheet & quilt. - Monday 9th High cool wind

Tuesday July 10th 1860 We visited at Jacob Heizers Cool wind Dry
Wednesday [^] We went to Mc Clure's & feasted on excellent Ice cream. We came home
by Dr J. Wallace's Cool wind Dry fine harvest weather

Thursday Cool in the morning & evening; Pleasant breeze Dry

Friday 13th We went to Gap. Cool mornings & evenings warm sun
midday but fine breeze from N. west.

Saturday July 14th 1860. 2 P.M. At the funeral of Annie E
Sides, daughter of John Sides of Intercourse, from Rev. 20. 12.

Sabbath July 15th 1860 10 At prayer meeting; 10^{1/2} p At Requiem from
Eccles. 5. 1. 3 At Compass hall, from Heb. 2. 3. first clause

7^{3/4} At prayer meeting at our house. Warm & dry.

Monday 16th 9 A.M. at the funeral of the Infant son of Samuel
Worst. from Rom. 5. 14. first clause: Afterwards I visited Mr Black
Warm & dry; fine cool breeze from west. clear. Evening visit
ed Mrs Parmer, John Coffroth, & Mrs Sively. 98.

Tuesday July 17th We visited Wm Stewart & wife & dined with
them. We then visited my brother Thomas Wallace & family
And Jacob Gibson & family & stayed over night with brother
Thomas, Thermometer about 94. Roads dusty.

Wednesday morning July 18th There was an Eclipse of the
Sun: About 10^{1/2} p A.M. We started home; & arrived safely a-
-bout 2 P.M. Thermometer about 93. very dry ^{light shower} ~~at~~ A

Thursday ^{fore} ~~after~~ noon a light shower. 94. windy

Friday Warm, but windy. Thermometer 94. light shower.

Saturday 21st Went to Thomas Mc Annelly's Cambridge
High wind all day but warm 93.

Sabbath July 22nd 1860. 10 A.M. at prayer meeting 10^{1/2} p

At Requiem from 1 Tim. 1. 5. 3 At the funeral of Mrs Sively;
I preached from 2 Cor. 5. 4. first clause; in our church, Pequea,

7^{3/4} P.M. Attended prayer meeting at the house of Daniel See,

The morning was remarkably cool & windy for the season; re-
sembling October: but afternoon it became warm It rain-
ed during the night, considerably; the sound of which was
very cheering, & called for thanksgiving & praise to God; for the
earth was parched & vegetation suffering.

Monday July 23rd It rained beautifully. all the forenoon un-
til between 10 & 11 O'clock It then cleared off, windy
