

Saturday May 26th 1866. We started from Rev. C. Stewarts, crossed the Susquehanna at Peach Bottom & arrived at Rev. T.M. Crawfords, about 2 P.M. Clouds & sun. Ther. about 55-75.

Sabbath May 27th 1866. 10 A.M. I preached for Mr Crawford, at Slate Ville; from John 12. 26. last clause & assisted to administer the Lord's Supper. Rained in the morning & a thunder gust & rain in the evening. We dined at Mr Crawford's. After dinner, I walked with Mr Crawford to a delightful ~~place~~ place of retirement, in a pine grove: & there sat down & conversed together about God &c. Our hearts burned with love while we talked together; & Jesus seemed to be spiritually present with us. And afterwards, we kneeled down together & we both prayed. We had a delightful season. Ther. about 55-78.

Monday May 28th Cloudy, cool & windy. 10 A.M. I preached at Slate Ville, from 1 Tim. 1. 15. The Lord assisted me greatly, both yesterday & today. After dinner, I accompanied Mr Crawford, & called to see my old friend, Rev. Samuel Parke. He was delighted to see me: & wept for joy. We then visited the slate quarries, after which we went to Mr Rufus Weily, & there met Mrs Wallace Miss Annie Crawford, & Mr & Mrs Weily, the father & mother of Rufus, & we all took tea together, & had a very pleasant time. We then returned to Mr Crawford's & spent the night.

Tuesday May 29th 1866. 8 A.M. We left Mr Crawford's, & turned our faces homeward. We crossed the river at Peach Bottom; & persevered on our journey (though it rained on us all the way) until we arrived at the house of Rev. Joseph Rittenhouse; & there stayed all night. In the evening, attended a Bible class in Georgetown; & exposted & prayed.

Wednesday May 30th We returned home safely. Cleared off afternoon: cold north west wind. O for gratitude & Supreme love to our kind preserver. Son John called a few minutes. Mrs Lynch & Mrs Gloumer called also.

Thursday May 31st I mowed the front yard. cool west wind
Ther. 54-79 clear.

Friday June 1st cloudy & sun. Son Trueman called & took supper.
I got 17^{1/2} bushel feed of John Rambo. Ther. 55-78. Rain at night.

Saturday June 2nd cloudy & sun. Ther. 55-80. Son John & children, called a short time. Rained at night.

Sabbath June 3rd 1866 Rained all the forenoon; so that I did not go to Peguea. Ther. 62 cool south east. wind. Rained afternoon.

Monday June 4th 1866. Rained early in the morning.
Continued very dark & threatening. Wind east. Ther. 59-80. Sun
shined beautiful & warm afternoon.

Tuesday June 5th 1866 I went to Lancaster. Cloudy in
the forenoon. Afternoon sun shined warm. Ther. 62-84.
Gust with thunder & heavy rain; in the evening wind west.

Wednesday June 6th Alternate clouds & sun. Ther. 68-87.
A shower fell afternoon. Daughter Rachel called; & son John, also.
Wind west.

Thursday June 7th Clear We called at Mc Neils Ther. 69-84

Friday June 8th We spent the afternoon at Son John's

Saturday June 9th Alternate clouds & sun, as yesterday. Ther. 55-68.
Wind east & cool. Very rain like, afternoon.

Sabbath June 10th Very dark & threatening. 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ A.M. at prayer-
meeting. 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ At Pequea, from Rom. 12. 2, first clause. Bless
the Lord O my soul. No appointment afternoon. No rain Ther.
60-78. Wind east.

Monday June 11th 1866. Clear & pleasant. Wind west. Ther. 61-
80 I went after supper to Son John's & then to mill.

Tuesday June 12th Clear & cool in the morning, Ther. 56-78.

3 I got 3 bushels of cotn & 53 $\frac{4}{5}$ lbs of flour of John Rambo. I also
battled a pair about 5 P.M.

Wednesday June 13th I went with Son John, to Walter Armstrongs.
A gust came on just as we arrived there & rained smartly. We re-
mained there all night. Pleasant day.

Thursday June 14th We went next morning to Newark, Del.
& Walter went with us. We then, on our return, stopped a few min-
utes at Fair Hill, with Rev. Mr. Johns, & Mr. H. Hess. Thence to Watters,
& stayed all night. Just as we got there a gust came, & it rained fast
for an hour or two. Beautiful day & warm.

Friday June 15th We returned home: Thanks to the Lord for his mer-
cies. Before we got quite home, we were overtaken with two gusts & heavy
rain. Very pleasant day.

Saturday June 16th Very pleasant. Alternate clouds & sun.

Sabbath June 17th 1866 Cloudy. Commenced raining soon after we went
to church. 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ At Pequea from 1 hot. 15. 1. The Lord assisted me. Rain-
ed very hard all day, & after night; & made quite a flood

Monday June 18th 1866. Clouds & sun. Ther. 65-78. We went to Cambridge after dinner. Several guests & rain in the evening.

Tuesday June 19th Clear & cool in the morning. Wind north west. Ther. 60-74. Mr & Mrs Suckie took dinner with us. Cloudy afternoon, & very cool. We sat by a ~~water~~ coal stove.

Wednesday June 20th Clear & cool. 10 A.M. At the funeral of Thomas J. Gault, aged 21, 6, 22. from Col. 3. 2.^{Day 88. 5 P.M.} Ther. 64-80. Mr & Mrs Kennedy, & their son James, took dinner with us.

Thursday June 21st Clear & pleasant I visited, talked, & prayed with Nathaniel Lynch, (who was deeply distressed about his soul,) at the house of his brother Joseph Lynch Ther. 65-81. I also called at Henry Eabys, to see their sick child. Mr John Lawrence & his Nephew Joseph Marple called & talked a while.

Friday June 22nd Clear pleasant. Ther. 68-83. We went & took dinner at Sarah M. Donlaps. Several guests, & very loud thunder went north towards evening.

Saturday June 23rd Cloudy in the morning. Sun shined at times, very hot. Sarah Lindon took dinner with us. Ther. 68-86.

Sabbath June 24th 1866. Clear & very pleasant. 10^{1/2} A.M. At Peguea. Mr A. C. Morrison, from Matt. 9. 12. The whole need not a physician &c. Cloudy in the evening. Ther. 68-94.

Monday June 25th Clear & very warm. We went to the Gap, & dined at Mrs J. Kennedy's. I then went to Son Stumars, & spent an hour very pleasantly, with my son & his wife. Ther. 70-98-100.

Tuesday June 26th We went to Cambridge, & I went on to Churchtown & married a pair; ~~I~~ ^{took} dinner with the wedding party, ^{at} the house of James McCaa Esq.; then returned to Cambridge, took tea at Rudolph Feasters, & returned home. Ther. 74-97-99. Wind south east.

Wednesday June 27th Some clouds in the morning. Wind northwest Ther. 74-86. Rained in the evening & at night.

Thursday June 28th Dark & rainy. Ther. 68-78. I went & took tea with my daughter M. Jane Dickinson. There was a smart rain fell about 5. P.M. Cool at night. Daughter Rachel took tea with Mrs Wallace.

Friday June 29th Clear, & cool; wind north west. Ther. 60-72. Cloudy in the evening. John Rambo brought a load of Hay.

Saturday June 30th Clear before noon. Some clouds afternoon Ther. 60-74

Son John called

Sabbath July 1st 1846 Clear & pleasant. 10 $\frac{1}{4}$. A.M. At prayer meeting. 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ At Pergaea, from Zech. 14. 20. O for holiness unto the Lord. Ther. 61-80-84

Monday July 2nd Clear & excellent hay weather. Ther. 64-86-94. I went to Elias Kutz, before breakfast. Then, after breakfast, to Thomas McNeils. Afternoon, Elias Kutz brought me a load of hay from Thomas McNeils. In the evening John & Morris Dickinson brought me a fine load of hay. And soon after they were gone, John Manner, sent me a large load of hay by his son Henry, Adam Diem, & Mr Lee. Thanks be to the good Lord, for kind friends & neighbours.

Tuesday July 3rd Clear & beautiful. Ther. 68-89- H. Wilson Robinson, sent me a large load of hay, with Gabriel Potton, about 6.A.M. Mr Lee, kindly assisted me in the hay-mow.

Wednesday July 4th Pleasant. 15th forenoon, sun-shine, yet some clouds. South wind. We visited, dined & then prayed with Mr & Mrs Keyser. We returned home about 3. P.M. & soon after it commenced raining; & rained smartly, accompanied with some thunder, for nearly an hour. Ther. 72-82. In the evening Mr Henry Morris sent me a fine load of beautiful hay. O, the goodness of God, in kind friends & neighbours.

Thursday July 5th Cloudy & calm. Ther. 71-89.

Friday July 6th Clear & very warm. 9.A.M. At the funeral of Mrs Rebekah Partner, aged 77. 5. 20. from Rev. 22. 12. first clause. The good Lord assisted me. Ther. 76-98-103. after 5 P.M. in sun.

Saturday July 7th Clear calm & sultry. Sarah M. Dunlap called a short time, & I took her a part of the way home. Ther. 78-100-103.

Thunder quiet in the evening & heavy rain. A Barn was burst with lightning.

Sabbath July 8th 1846 Sun & some clouds. I married a pair about 8. A.M. 10 $\frac{1}{4}$. At prayer meeting. 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ At Pergaea, from Matt. 9. 37, 38. Excessive warm in church. Ther. 76-97. A heavy quiet between four & five o'clock. P.M. Very loud thunder, & much rain, & high west wind. Rained at night.

Monday July 9th Cloudy. Wind west. Showery, afternoon, & some thunder. Ther. 76-80. Daughter Rachel called a few minutes. Rained at night.

Tuesday July 10th Shower in the morning. Cool. Wind north east. Ther. 62-76. Dr George Junkin & Mr Bonroy, dined with us. It is 30 years about 6 months, since I saw Dr Junkin.
