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Folder 1 The charter of the New Holland Debating Society, written 3 January 1816. Includes signatures of members. Notation on reverse of document indicates that all members of the society are deceased as of 6 August 1879 “excepting my brother Solomon Diller and myself, Roland Diller”. A second notation also indicates that all are deceased and that ten of the 23 members were known to the writer, and that twenty of the 23 were of German descent. This notation is signed F. R. D. and dated 3 September 1901. *Gift of George C. Roland, 1901. Transferred from Document Collection Box 5, Folder 7, Item 8, 24 January 2022.*
