K NOW all Men by these Presents, that WE
Mary McClinton, Ambrose Brown and
David Steel

all of the County of Lancaster, and Province of Pennsylvania, are held and firmly bound unto *Benjamin Chew* Esq; Register-General for the Probate of Wills, and granting Letters of Administration in the Province of Pennsylvania, in the Sum of *Five Hundred* Pounds, lawful Money of the said Province, to be paid unto the said *Benjamin Chew* or to his certain Attorney, Executors, Administrators, or Assigns. To the which Payment well and truly to be made, We do bind ourselves jointly and severally, our Heirs, Executors, and Administrators, each and every of them, firmly by these Presents. Sealed with our Seals, and dated this *Twenty sixth* Day of *October* in the Year of our LORD, One Thousand Seven Hundred and *seventy three* 43

THE Condition of the above Obligation is such, That if the above-bounded *Mary McClinton*

Administratrix of all and singular the Goods and Chattles, and Credits, of *Robert McClinton* deceased ~~do~~ make, or cause to be made, a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods and Chattles, and Credits, of the said deceased, which have, or shall come to the Hands, Possession or Knowledge of the said *Mary*

Persons for *her* and the same so made, do exhibit, or cause to be exhibited, into the Register's Office in the County of Lancaster, at or before the *Twenty sixth* Day of *November* next ensuing, and the same Goods, Chattles, and Credits, and all other Goods, Chattles, and Credits, of the said deceased, at the Time of *her* Death, which at any Time after, shall come to the Hands or Possession of the said *Mary*

McClinton Possession of any other Person or Persons for *her* well and truly administer, according to Law: And further, ~~doth~~ make, or cause to be made, a true and just Account of said Administration, at or before the *Twenty sixth* Day of *October* next, which will be in the Year of our Lord, One Thousand Seven Hundred and *seventy three* and all the Rest and Residue of the said Goods, Chattles and Credits, which shall be found remaining upon the said Administrators Account (the same being first examined and allowed of by the Orphan's Court of the County aforesaid) ~~doth~~ deliver and pay unto such Person or Persons respectively, as the said Orphan's Court by their Decree or Sentence (pursuant to the true Intent and meaning of an Act, intituled, *"An Act for the better settling Intestates Estates"*) shall limit and appoint. And if it shall hereafter appear that any last Will and Testament was made by the said deceased, and the Executor and Executors therein named, do exhibit the same into the Register's Office *McClinton* making request to have it allowed and approved accordingly; if the said *Mary McClinton* above-bounded being thereunto required, ~~doth~~ render and deliver the said Letters of Administration (Approbation of such Testament being first had and made in the said Register's Office) then this Obligation to be void, and of none Effect, or else to remain in full Force and Virtue.
