Casper Massler Foreman
Pleads Non Culpa

Lancaster County to wit

The Grand Inquest for our Sovereign Lord the King who now is for Lancaster County aforesaid Upon their Oath and Affirmation respectively do present That William McClintock of Lancaster County Yeoman contriving and wickedly intending the honest liege Subjects of our said Lord the King to cheat deceive and defraud the tenth Day of December in the thirty third Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Second King of Great Britain France and Ireland Defender of the Faith &c at Lancaster in the County of Lancaster and within the Jurisdiction of this Court with Force and Arms to falsely unlawfully fraudulently and deceitfully did make compose write and forge and did cause to be made composed written and forged a certain false and counterfeit Writing in the form of a genuine Certificate from Alexander Stedman, John St Clair, Samuel McCall the younger and John Inglis, Persons legally impowered and commissioned to examine and certify what Sums of Money were due and owing from our Sovereign Lord the King to the Subjects of our same Lord the King who had done Services for our said Lord the King in the Expedition against ^{the Enemy of his said} Majesty under the Command of ~~Commander~~ General John Forbes, which same false and counterfeit Writing follows in the words and Figures following to wit, "Philadelphia ps. It appears to us
" the Subscribers, that there remains due to William McClintock
" the Sum of Fifty eight Pounds Eight Shillings and four pence
" Pennsylvania for Services done in the Expedition under the
" late General Forbes. As witness our Hands this 2 May 1759
" Alex^r Stedman John St Clair Sam: McCall Jun^r John Inglis"
as by the said false and counterfeit Writing more fully appeareth, And that the said William McClintock the aforesaid tenth day of December in the Year aforesaid at the County aforesaid knowingly falsely and deceitfully the false

and counterfeit writing aforesaid as the true and genuine Certificate
of the aforesaid Alexander Stedman John St'clair Samuel McCall
the younger and John Inglis did publish and caused to be published
He the said William McIntock then and there well knowing the
said false and counterfeit writing to be as aforesaid false and
counterfeit, In Contempt of our Sovereign Lord the now King and
his Laws, To the evil Example of all others in such case offending
And against the Peace of our said Lord the King his Crown and
Dignity &c -
