The Grand Inquest for our Sovereign Lord the King that now is for Lancaster County aforesaid upon their Oath & Affirmation respectively do present That James English of Lancaster County Yeoman, James English the younger of Lancaster County Yeoman William Gorman of Lancaster County Yeoman and James Miranda of Lancaster County Yeoman

The twenty ninth Day of October in the fourth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the third King of Great Britain France & Ireland Defender of the Faith &c. at Paxton Township in the County afores. & within the Jurisdiction of this Court

with Force & Arms &c. Two wooden Boxes of the value of Five Shillings, Fifteen pounds in money numbered in the Bills of Credit of the province of New Jersey, One hundred pieces of Spanish coined Silver called pieces of eight of the value of Thirty Seven pounds ten shillings, One woman's scarlet cloth Cloak of the value of fifteen shillings, one black silk woman's Bonnet of the value of twelve shillings, one piece of fine Linen of the value of Fifty Shillings three pieces of Cambric of the value of Fifteen pounds, Six pair of Stone & Silver Silver Buttons of the value of thirty shillings, three pair of woman's silk Mittens of the value of Twenty shillings, two pair of men's worsted Stockings of the value of Fifteen shillings and eight yards of silk Ribbon of the value of six shillings

of the Goods & Chattels of John McQuaid

then & there being found that & there feloniously did steal take & bear away against the Peace of our said Lord the King his Crown & Dignity &c.
