The GRAND INQUEST of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, inquiring for the County of Lancaster, upon their oaths and affirmations respectively do present, That

late of the county aforesaid, yeomen, on the *19th* day of *August* A. D., 1873, at the County aforesaid and within the jurisdiction of this Court, then and there having been duly elected, and during the said time being and acting as the supervisors of *Penn* township, in said county, unlawfully neglected and refused, and during all the same time have unlawfully neglected and refused to repair and open and keep open to and of the lawful width of thirty-three feet, so

much of a certain public road or highway *running from the Borough*
of Manheim to Mount Hope and
known as the Lebanon road

whereby, and by reason whereof, that part of the said public road or highway described as aforesaid, in the County aforesaid, has become so delapidated, narrowed and obstructed that the citizens of this Commonwealth cannot pass and repass, along, upon, and over the same, with their horses, wagons and carriages, as freely as they are entitled to do, to the great damage and common nuisance of all citizens of the Commonwealth having occasion to use the said road, contrary to the form of the Act of the General Assembly in such case made and provided, and againts the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
